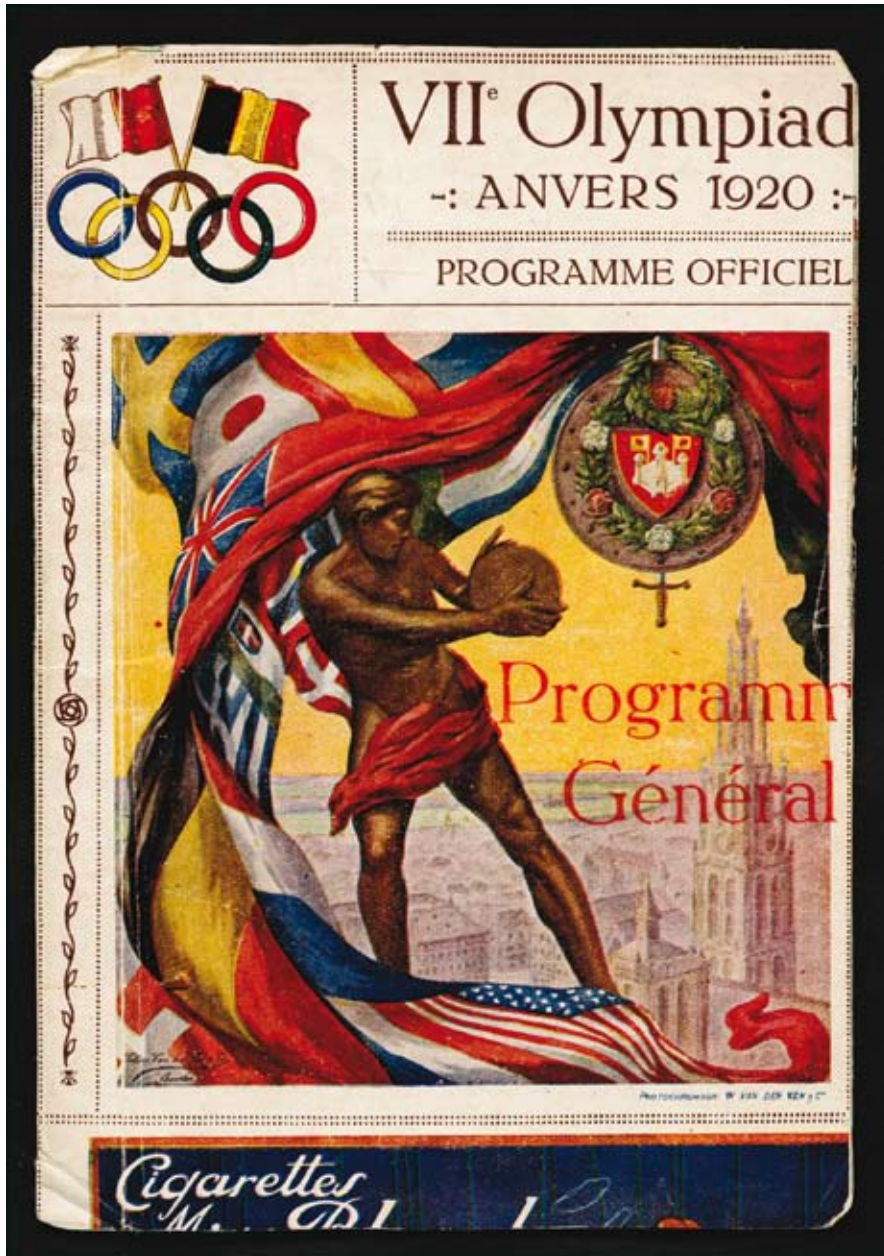

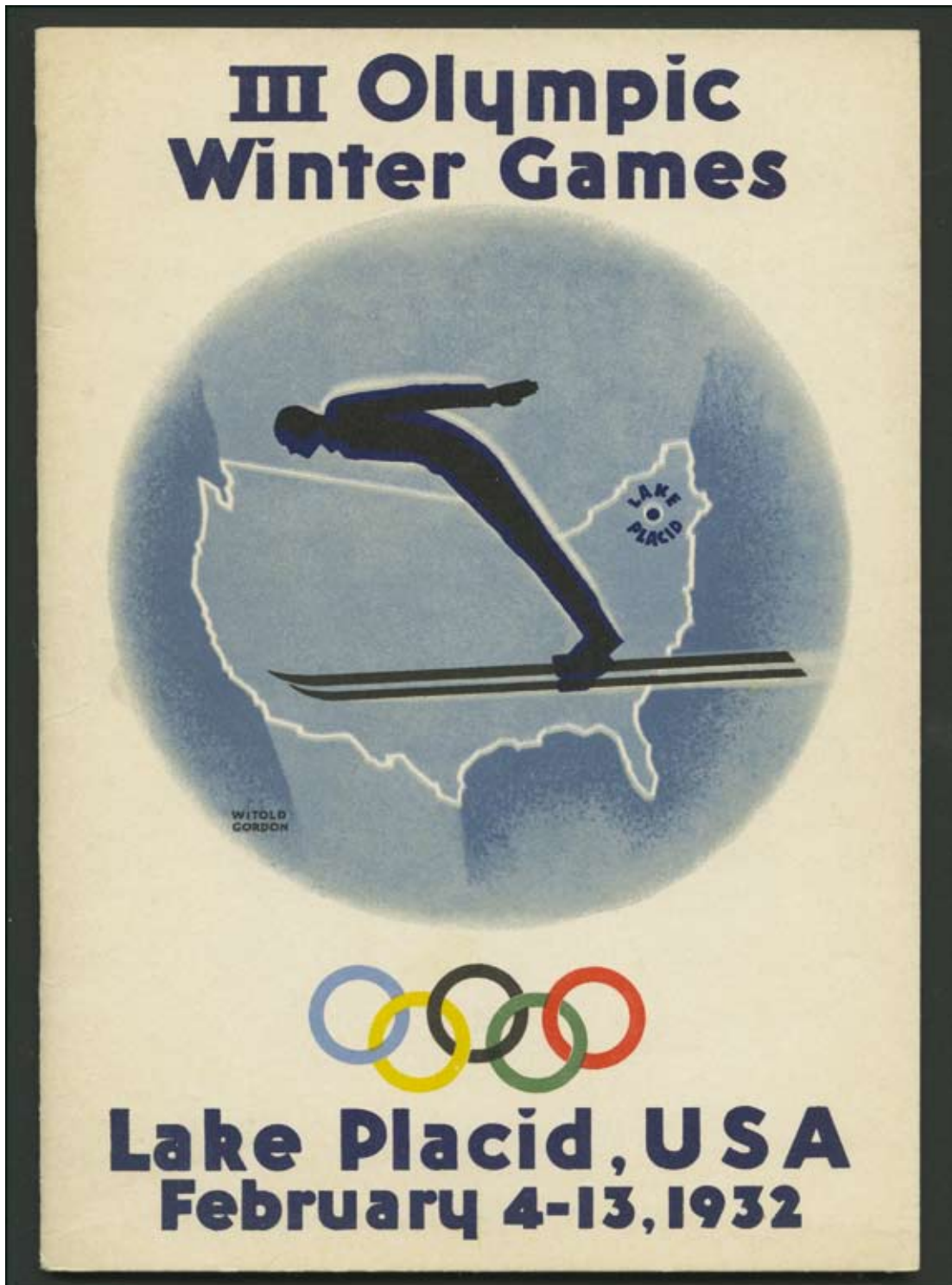

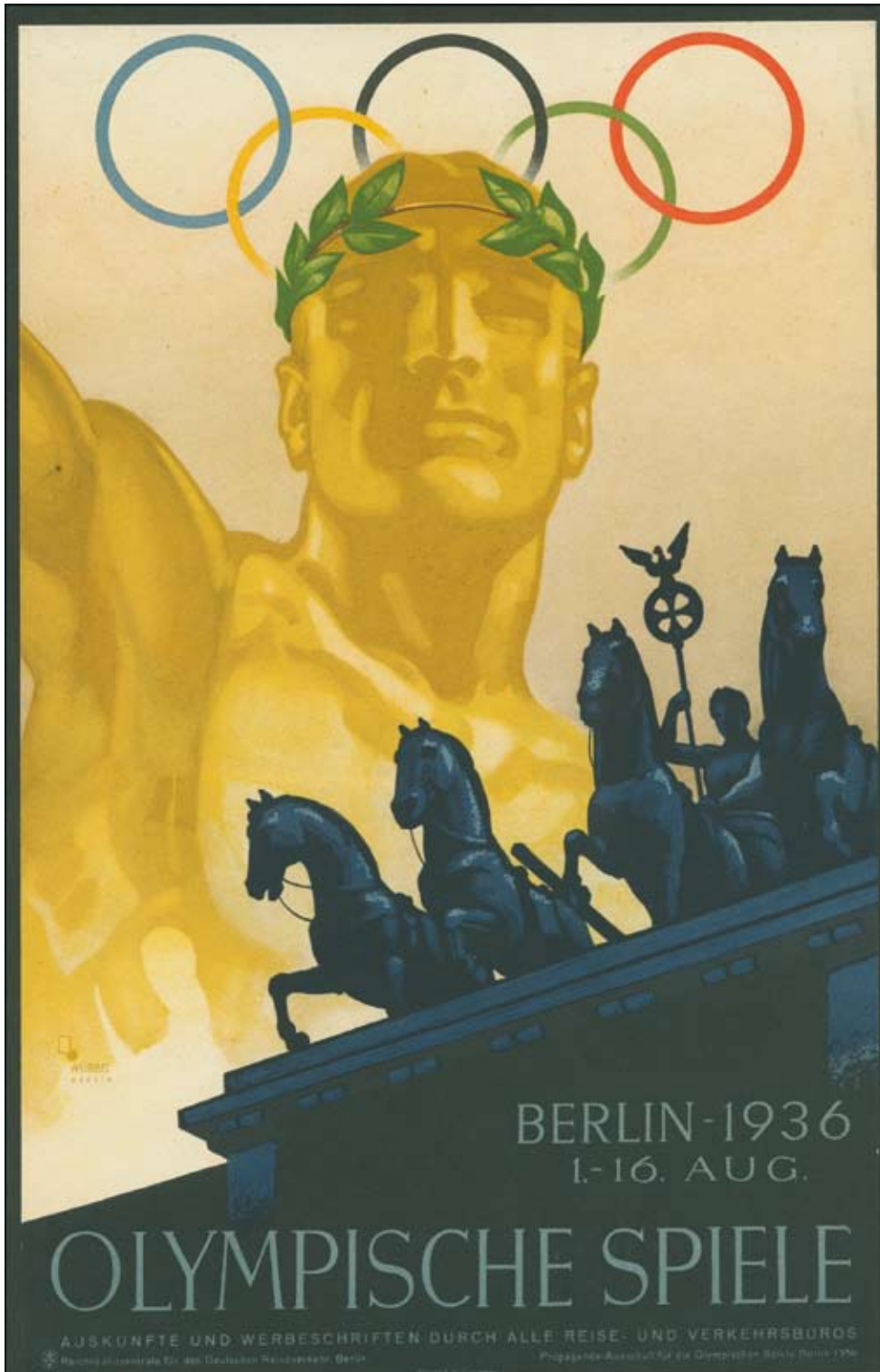

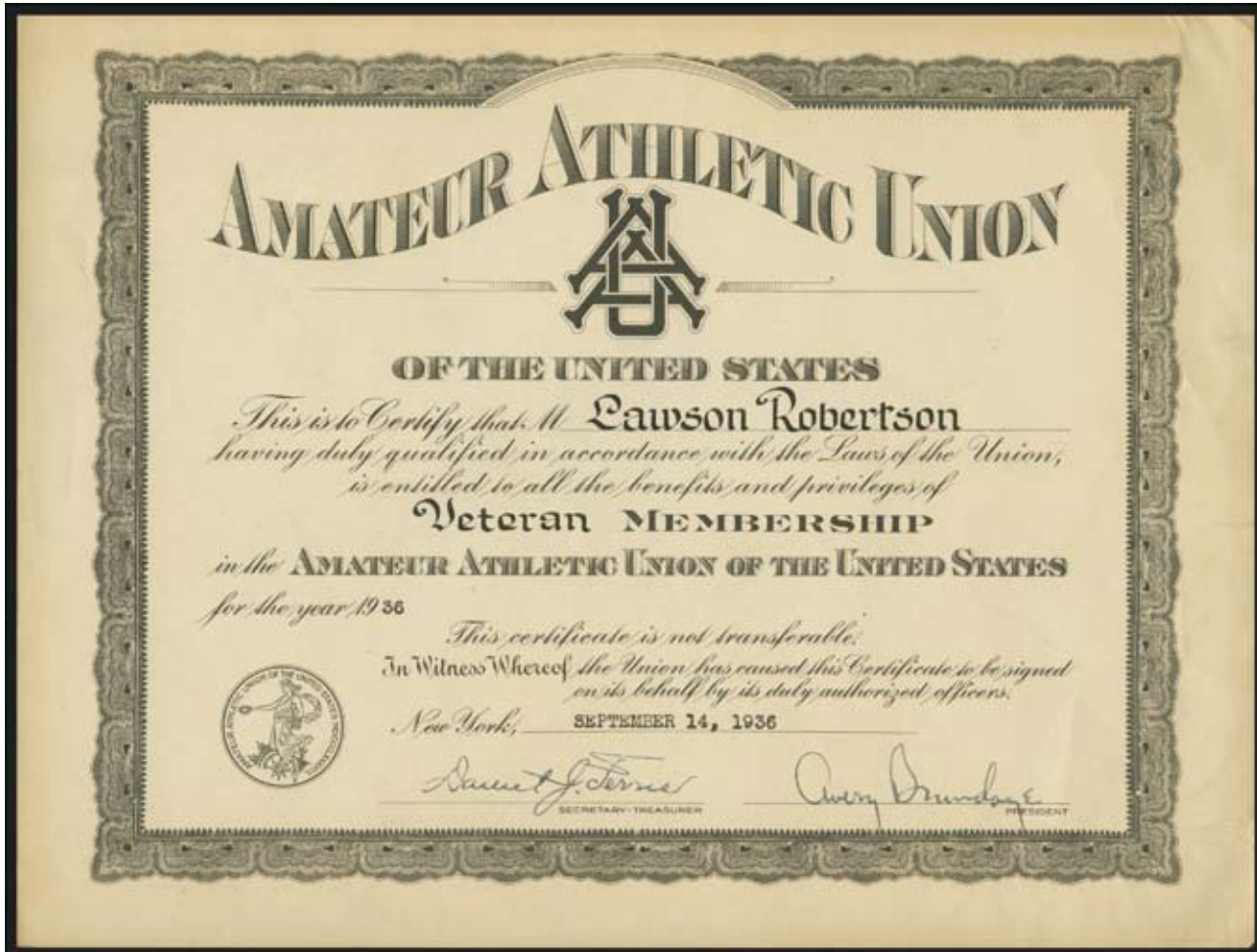

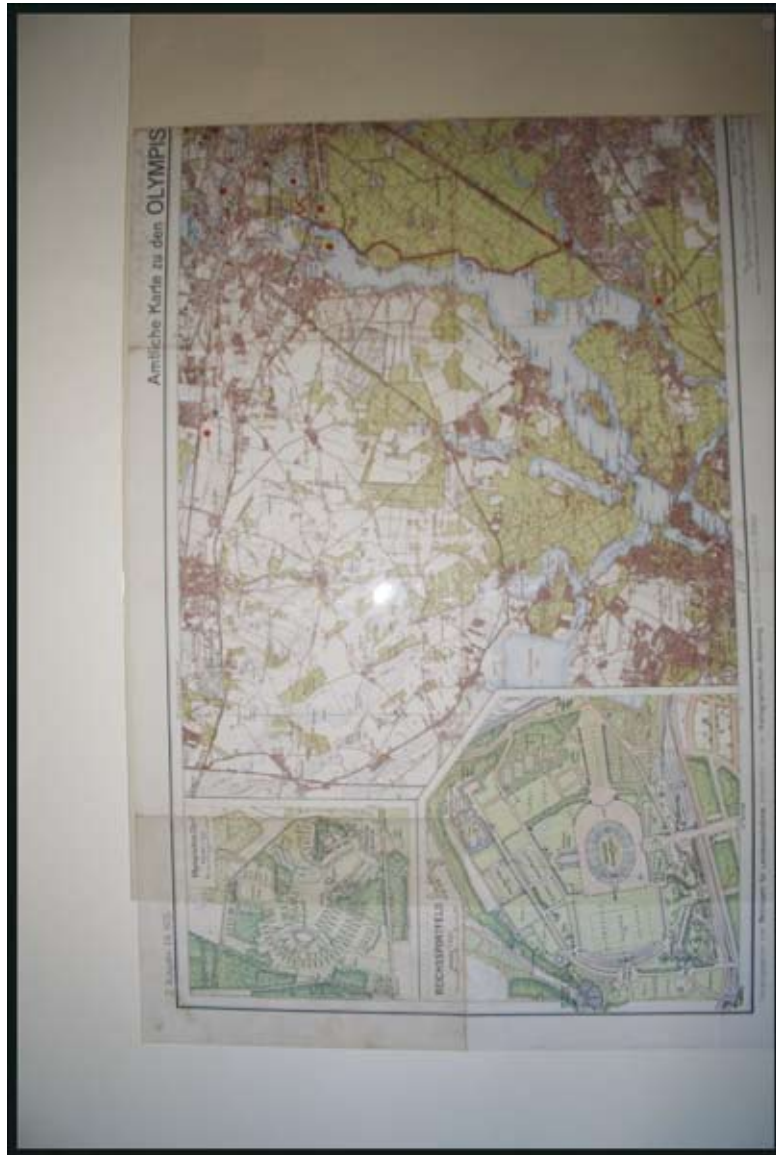

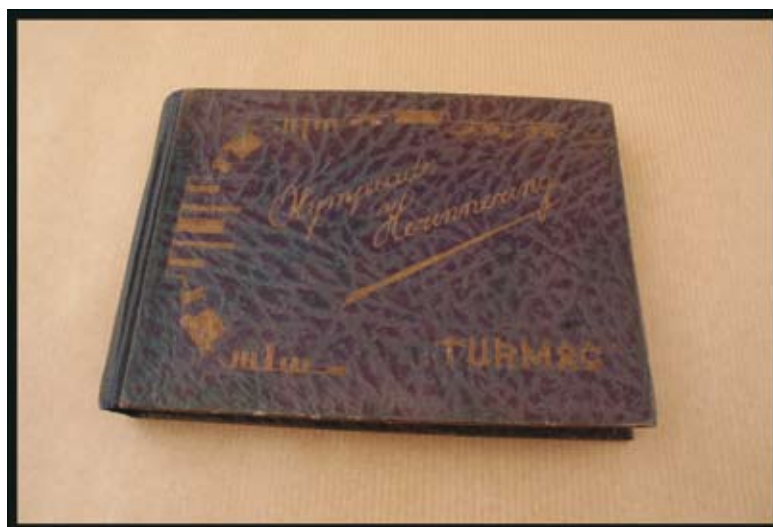

En Octubre 1939, salió el primer número del Boletín Olímpico que publicamos en siete idiomas para su distribución no sólo a la prensa mundial sino también a las organizaciones deportivas, en primer lugar a los diferentes Comités Olímpicos Nacionales. Sin perjuicio de continuar el servicio de informes bajo dichas formas, este Comité se propone tomar especial comunicación con los Comités Nacionales en toda cuestión de detalle referente a preparativos olímpicos, y lo hará mediante una serie de Circulares; siendo ésta la primera de ellas.

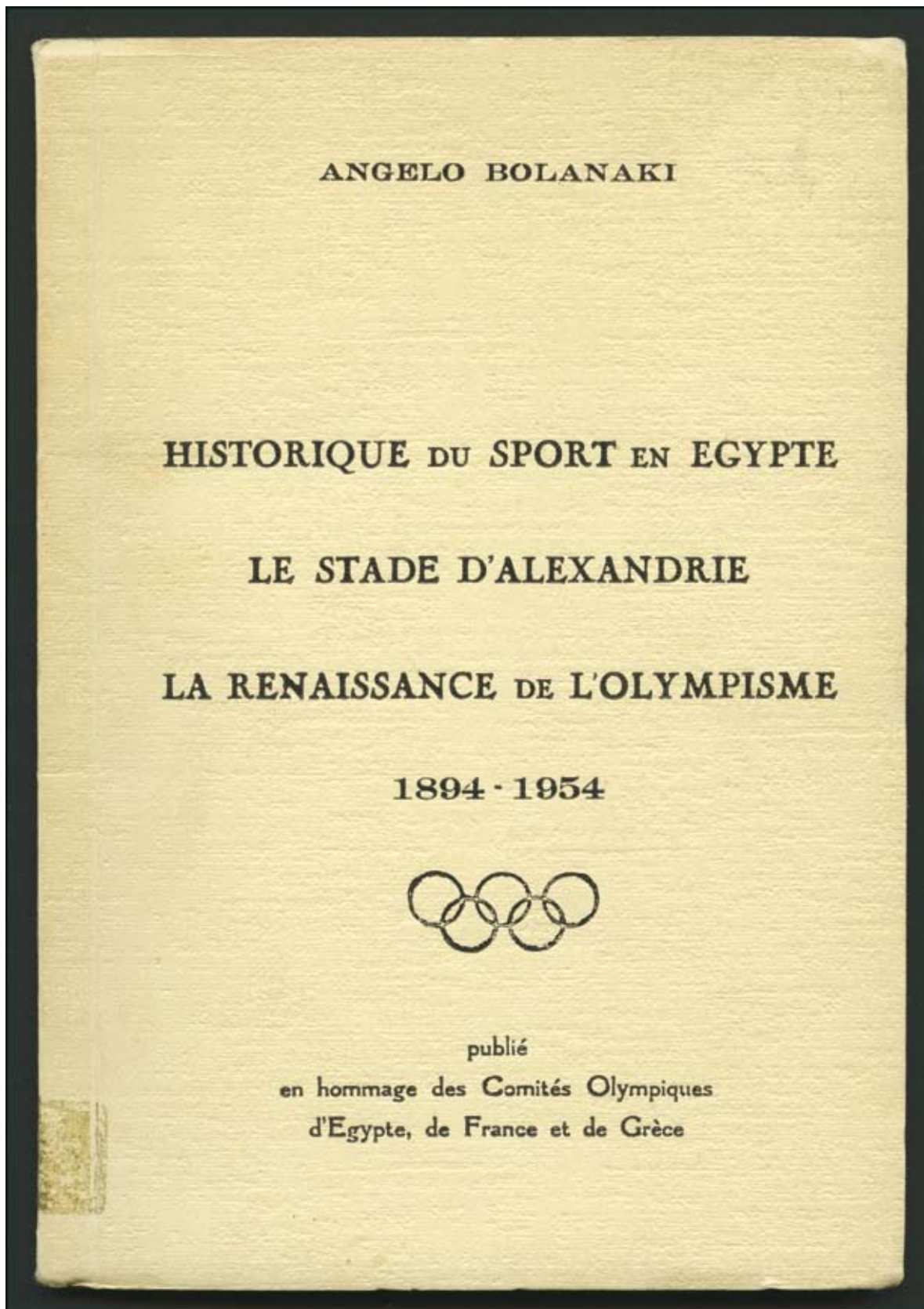
