Foreword

The "Athena" Collection was formed painstakingly and by hard work during a period of over 35 years by a fervent, passionate and eminent collector with extremely deep knowledge of Large Hermes Heads.

The Collection over the years received the highest distinctions in numerous important international exhibitions and, ultimately, in 1996 the "Grand Prix d' honneur", the top distinction that can be awarded to a stamp collection.

The collection includes unused, used, multiples and covers, often the finest, the largest or the only (Bob Odenweller). Others characterised the collection as the "collection sacrée" (Roger Loeuillet).

On November 20, 1997, the "Athena" Grand Prix Collection of Large Hermes Heads, at the invitation of the Royal Philatelic Society was exhibited in the Society's premises in London. DR. ALAN HUGGINS, MBE, RDP, FRPSL, was asked by President JANE MOUBRAY to give the vote of thanks to the Exhibitor.

Dr. Huggins, one of the most senior figures in world philately, said there were inadequate words in the English language to fully justify the truly outstanding rarity and quality of the material that had been exhibited.

He said that in the twelve frames, each of twelve pages, the viewer not only had the opportunity of seeing a magnificent and rare piece in every frame but on virtually EVERY page in every frame!. The presentation accompanying the display was extremely informative and Dr. Huggins confessed that he now appreciated that his previous knowledge of Hermes Heads was minimal compared with what he had learned from the "Athena Collection of Large Hermes Heads", that he characterised as "display of displays".


Dr. Huggins continued by saying that the audience, which filled the Society's meeting room, were privileged to have witnessed possibly the best collection that has ever been assembled of these beautiful stamps and he heartily congratulated the Exhibitor.

Introduction Greece as a Grand Prix Collection



Building a Grand Prix collection is not easy. Foremost in the process is the need for a country whose stamps are of sufficient complexity and rarity to be considered for philately's top prize. But that is only the start.

Next comes a very long process of waiting for each of the best items to become available. For some countries the finest material is so hopelessly tied up in collections or museums that waiting for it to reach the market is sure to frustrate any thoughts of forming a major collection. In 1969, Sir John Wilson, Keeper of the Royal Collection, told me a short cut to this process. He said "buy a few gold medal collections, remove the best parts for your collection and sell the rest." That wasn't easy then, and is even more difficult today. If the opportunity should arise, however, a fortunate collector can eliminate the twenty or so years of searching since someone else will have done it for him.

So today we have a rare combination of circumstances with Classic Greece. A large number of the most outstanding rarities are reaching the market at the same time, offering a chance that is unlikely to be repeated for many years to come.

The Large Hermes Heads are unique in that they feature "control numbers" on the higher values of all but the first and last issues. These numbers, applied both to help identify them (because the actual design numbers were very small) and possibly to thwart counterfeiting, have created a complexity and rarity that is deserving of international attention. With two different printing steps involved, it is inevitable that mistakes would occur, and they did. Numbers are inverted, printed on the front, and in the wrong colours. Each has made a rarity of stamps that are already difficult to find as fine examples of the normal stamps.

It is safe to say that virtually every rarity of the Large Hermes Heads will become available within the next year or so, and in some of the finest condition available. Covers and usages to and from foreign countries are, in some cases, unique, and they too are soon to be found in sales. So much material, in fact, that more than one person can create an exhibit of considerable substance.

The Athena Collection is a gold mine of the largest known multiples, unusual destinations, combination covers, and examples of many important items that cannot be found elsewhere. Condition is generally excellent and the coverage of each issue is exceptionally strong. In short, this is a wonderful point to start to build a Grand Prix collection.



The 10L value has control numerals "10" that are 8mm tall and the remaining values are without control numerals. They are the finest of the Large Hermes Heads.



1861-62 FIRST ATHENS PRINT PROVISIONAL PRINTING OF THE 20L

The 20 lepta because it constituted the primary rate was the first stamp to be printed in Athens. The process of printing was not advanced enough to include control numerals except the experiment of Karpenission Error. The printing was coarse and heavy. Under this denomination are included the so-called "quadrille background" (visible chiefly in the medallion) and the "solid background". They were used mainly in Athens ("1"), Pyrgos ("13") and Karpenission ("44").

A third example illustrated in Constantinides is not reported for many years and by now must be considered lost.

Even though the exact status of these stamps is still uncertain, it now seems fairly obvious that they constitute a first "essay" of the control figures of the Athens provisional printings. In fact, during the printing of the first 20 Lep (quadrille - solid background) the Greek printers tried unsuccessfully to print 9 mm control figures on the back of 20 Lep, approximately similar in size to those of Paris 10 Lep printing (8 mm), but these figures were considered too big and grotesque, and, thus, have been abandoned. Consequently, all the first 20 Lep coarse provisionals are without figures. However, one experimental sheet of these stamps, with negative figures, has been sent, probably by mistake, to Karpenission and circulated through the local ("44") post office. This stamp is touched at T and right.

An exceedingly important item for the study of Large Hermes Heads, and one of the greatest rarities in Greek philately (Coundouros "The Control Numerals and the classification of the stamps of the Large Hermes Heads", par. 12.1), Ex Guire-Lea. Unpriced in Vlastos (9(infor) and Hellas (8 III).
