## Great Britain



Madeleine Smith's love letter to Emile (Pierre Emile L'Angelier), signed Mimi, in 1855 she, the beautiful daughter of a wealthy Glasgow merchant, began a secret love affair with Pierre Emile L'Angelier, but Madeleine's parents, not knowing about the affair, found a suitable fiancé for her within the Glasgow upper-middle class, so Madeleine attempted to break her connection with Emile and asked him to return the letters she had written to him, instead Emile threatened to use those letter to expose her and force her to marry him, she was soon observed in a drugstore, ordering arsenic, and early in the morning of March 23, 1857, Emile died from arsenic poisoning; after Madeleine's letters were found in his house, she was arrested for murder, and the trail garnered headlines worldwide, but nothing could be proven and she was acquitted, one of a few known letters in private possession, Very Fine, ex-Faulstich and Fitz, interested persons can read more at www.amostcuriousmurder.com (or buy the book).

1954 Prestwick Scotland Air Crash 6p QE II Aerogramme, with burned top and right edges and "Salvaged Mail Aircraft Crash Prestwick 25-12-54" rectangular handstamp at top, to Fort Erie, Ontario, Canada, accompanied by envelope with same rectangular crash handstamp from the Post Office into which the aerograme was placed upon recovery to finish its journey, Very Fine, according to Wikipedia, early on Christmas Day 1954, a British aircraft crashed while landing at Prestwick Airport, killing 28 of the 36 passengers and crew onboard, the plane had been carrying diamonds valued at $£ 1,000,000$, an extensive search was carried out in the area surrounding the crash, resulting in over $90 \%$ of the diamonds being recovered, ex Fitz.

"PO" at top left, blue Baltimore Md. circular datestamp, blue " 5 " in oval and blue "Paid" straightline cancels, Beatty correspondence to Hagerstown Md., one August 22, 1846, other Sept. 15, 1845, Very Fine and scarce; this marking has sometimes been confused with the prepaid provisional entires, Baltimore postal history specialist Denwood Kelly believed that these handstamps were applied by the sender to the top letter of prepaid bundles deposited at the post office, ex Weill (Postmaster Prov. sale 10/12/89; lots 606 and 608) with 1989 PF certificates obtained one month after the auction, where they fetched \$2,600 hammer (combined).

MASSACHUSETTS


Charles M. Willard, Ludlow Mass. Red and black printed circular to the $\mathbf{1 , 0 0 0 - 1 , 5 0 0}$ postmaster at East Hebron Me. from Charles M. Willard, a manufacturer of postmarking devices offering them for sale; in the circular, Willard states that he used to get them from "Mr. Zevely of Maryland" but because Zevely claimed he could not supply the superior "Box wood" and red ink as he claimed (and as Willard had previously advertised), instead using metal and black ink; Willard was now offering the "Box wood" and red ink at half of the price he previously quoted (\$1); the first page shows a beautiful display of markings ("Paid 3", 5, V and X in circles, "Paid", "Free", "Ludlow Mass cds.", and all months and dates in red (as it would appear if used on a piece of mail), as well as a "Ludlow Mass. Jun. 1" cds and "Paid" printed in red on the address panel; Extremely Fine and rare, a gorgeous advertising item.

## NEW JERSEY



New Jersey Stagecoach Mail, 1797, two folded letters from Mount Holly, NJ to John Clark in Philadelphia, one datelined July 27 with ms. "pr stage", other April 6 with "care of the stage", no postal markings, latter needs to be reassembled, still Fine-Very Fine.

## PENNSYLVANIA



1833 Letter to George Wolf, Gov. of Pa., no postal markings, datelined
Norristown (Pa) January 23, 1833, letter requesting the governor to issue a proclamation for a $\$ 200$ reward for discovery and apprehension of the murderer of 18 year old Hester Fisher, paid upon conviction, letter states, "victim's body was taken from Schuylkill River, identified by her sister, had a silk handkerchief tied twice around her neck, tight as could be drawn, body bruised, ravished \& murdered," brief note authorizing the proclamation written and signed by the Governor, some splitting along file folds, still Very Fine, ex Fitz.
