





1840 1d black pl.1a GI-GJ horizontal pair, with large balanced margins, affixed to a piece of laid paper, GI tied by a superb clear strike of the red Maltese Cross and GJ tied by a very fine clear strike of the black London "T/MY - 13/1840" circular date stamp, the piece inscribed "Obliterating stamp" and "dated stamp in ink" denoting the respective cancellations; The finest of all the known examples of this cancellation trial, including that of R.M. Phillips in the National Postal Museum. A spectacular Great Britain rarity, of major importance and worthy of the greatest exhibit.

1840 1d Mulready envelope, Forme 2 stereo A153, sent from **Vera Cruz, Mexico**, to Liverpool via New York cancelled by a red oval handstamp of Gilpins Exchange - Reading Room and Foreign Letter Office - New York with a handstruck "8" (Robertson M65) alongside indicating an 8d charge as an incoming Ship Letter. Backstamped with a Vera Cruz dispatch cds for 16th December, a F.Karck of New York forwarding agents cachet and a "Liverpool / Ship Letter" handstamp (Robertson type S14). This famous Mulready remains the sole recorded example posted to the UK from outside Europe. An important and extremely attractive exhibition piece.

1841 (Jun 5) 1d Mulready envelope, stereo A164, sent within Wales from Pontypool to Clydach Iron Works, uprated with 1840 2d blue pl.1 HL (three good to very large margins) and 1841 1d red pl.8 HC (four fine to good margins), all neatly struck by black Malteses Crosses, reverse with Pontypool UDC and Abergavenny arrival, minor soiling, a very attractive and rare combination on a Mulready.



1840 (Sep 8) 2d Mulready envelope, stereo a202, sent from London to "Wingan" (Wingham, Kent), uprated with 1840 1d black pl.6 QK (showing re-entry in "K" square) and both cancelled by red Maltese Cross, further manuscript "1" indicating 1d paid in cash to pay the 4d rate, with Vere Street "Maltese Cross" despatch ds, minor soiling, a very rare uprated usage of the 2d Mulready with both a stamp and cash payment. It is stated to be the finest of the two known examples.

1846 (Apr 29) 2d Mulready envelope sent within London and uprated with 1841 2d blue pl.3 FD, three margins and small scissor cut in "F" square, both cancelled by London Inland "70" numerals with Fleet Street T.P. two-line despatch hs, reverse with London ds, a very rare uprated late usage.

1846 (Sep) 2d Mulready lettersheet, forme 1 stereo a92, uprated to the 6d per 3oz rate with two additional 1841 2d blue pl.3 BG and BH (BG just touched at left). Sent from Hayes via Uxbridge and London to Cobham, the Mulready and stamps were originally left uncancelled the stamps were then lightly cancelled with Uxbridge "830" numerals then subsequently cancelled in transit again with London city office "17" numerals. Also shows a red Hayes-Town UDC and Cobham arrival cds on face for SP.29.1846 with Uxbridge and London transit stamps on reverse for SP.26-28.1846. A very rare uprated Mulready, one of only four such recorded frankings (S.G. £35'000).

1840 (May 9) entire to Manchester bearing a superb 1840 1d black pl.1a MH-NJ block of six, with good margins all round, neatly tied by good strikes of orange-red MCs, endorsed "under 3 ozs" and with "Chester MY 9 1840" arrival strike. A remarkable and important multiple use of the 1d black within the first four days of official use, and incredibly rare with only this block used on May 9th, and the block of ten used on first day of issue in the Royal collection known.

1841 (18 Jul) Solicitor's entire to London, bearing two horizontal strips of five 1840 1d greyblack (very worn impression) pl.1a HA-HE and IG-IK paying the 10d rate for up to 5 ounces, each cancelled by black Maltese Crosses (very rare on this plate), backstamped Stone (18. 7.41) double-arc cds, and London 19. 7.41 arrival cds, the adhesives lifted, creasing reduced and hinged back in place, and the name and address partially re-written, nonetheless a magnificent and highly important franking.



1840 (Jun 16) Folded letter with a dual address from Liverpool through a forwarding agent in London to **Le Havre in France**, with the inland rate paid by a 1840 1d black pl.2 IB (fine to very good margins, top left corner with tiny tear in the margin only) tied by a red Maltese cross, backstamped with Liverpool and London cds. After reception in the London office it was forwarded by "Messrs. Redhead & Spears" to Southampton, delivered to a private ship, further to Le Havre, where it was rated with 3 decimes with French "OUTRE-MER/ 17/ JUIN/ 40 LE HAVRE" entry ds (see Van der Linden certificate for the details on this rate).

A sensational and extremely rare strip, **thought to be the largest recorded vertical strip known on cover**, a showpiece of the highest calibre.



Official, JF, the famous "Largentière" cover, first recorded in 1899, used on entire from London to Tetbury, Gloucestershire, dated 3 Jul 1840, the stamp with large balanced margins all round, tied by red Maltese cross, incredibly the stamp and portion of the top right corner of the entire were at some time removed then thankfully reattached at a later date to preserve this magnificent rarity **widely regarded as the finest "VR" cover of the very few examples known**, a major exhibition show piece and without a doubt, one of the most important covers of British Philately.



1841 (13 May) 1840 2d. blue Pl. 1, G(H) **vertically bisected** and with close to very large margins, tied by two strikes of the black Maltese Cross on entire to Beverley, the reverse with a very fine strike of open-top Hull despatch c.d.s. An outstanding use of this bisect on entire which is considered the finest of the three known, all of which are from the same correspondence. An exceptionally rare cover of exhibition quality. Astonishingly, the other half lettered H, also on entire dated 14 May 1841 is also included, making **an outstanding and incomparable exhibition showpiece**.

In 1936, a solicitor in Hull discovered three bisected 1840 Two Pence Blue stamps in his office correspondence. He tore them off the letters and they were later sold at auction in February 1937, the pieces bore Hull or Lincoln postmarks. A few years later, a solicitor in Beverley turned out some old papers and threw into the bin some old stamps on letters. A friend called round later the same day and reminded him that another solicitor had found some old stamps cut in half a few years earlier, so the letters were retrieved and one example was found, then a search among old files produced another. Both entires were postmarked at Hull, the first on March 27 1841, (this example sold in the collection of Lord Vestey along with the other half on piece as displayed at the R.P.S.L in 2009), the latter on May 13 1841.



The foreign Office however decided to send the letter via France (for this route 1/7 would have been sufficient, although only prepaid to the Swiss or German border e.g. the French offices of Huningen or Forbach). This route was confirmed by the Paris marking "A.T.F". In Trieste the letter was charged "38" kreuzer C.M. (Convention currency), to be split up in 14 kreuzer domestic charge (tariff on foreign incoming letters 1817-1842) + 10 kreuzer Swiss and 14 kreuzer French transit, the latter being prepaid, but neglected by the Austrians.
